

Guardianship and the Assumption of Risk

Army Group 1944

Army Group 1944's official board policy for minors requires their parents to sign over temporary legal guardianship of their child in order to participate unaccompanied at tactical events. While this policy allows for minors to participate without their parents being physically present, it also requires a designated AG44 member present at the event to assume responsibility for all aspects of the minor's well-being.

These responsibilities may include, but not be limited to:

- Knowledge of any medical conditions, as well as any medications or the administration thereof for the designated minor
- Making healthcare decisions for the minor under their care, including emergency medical or dental treatment
- Ensuring that the minor adheres to safety protocols at all times during tactical events, including responsible firearm use
- Supervising the minor's adherence to all local, state, and federal laws regarding the use of tobacco, alcohol, or controlled substances
- Ensuring the safety, health, and well-being of the minor in question
- Modeling and ensuring proper behavior and conduct
- Assuming personal responsibility for any damages incurred by the minor
- Assuming personal responsibility for the injury or wrongful death of a minor

This system is meant to ensure that minors who choose to participate in AG44 events with the support of their parents or legal guardians are provided with adequate safety measures and support from an on-site temporary guardian. This also provides legal protection for the organization as a whole, as it places the responsibility for maintaining appropriate safety practices on the guardian, rather than the club. This will help ensure the continued legally responsible operation of our organization.
